



## It's dreamland for 'the little club up on the hill'

FOREST Green Rovers, the 'little club on the hill', scaled football mountain to create history at Wembley Stadium on Sunday.

And how the non-league min nows from Nailsworth deserved their moment in the sun, making their home town the smallest par ish to ever host a Football League club as they stunned Tranmere Rovers to win the National League play-off final.

Goals of beauty, including a first-half brace from Wigan loanee Kaiyne Woolery and Chris-tian Doidge's 27th goal of the the promised land of the Footall League Two in a game worth £1.5m to the winners and with it the opportunity to reshape their

Manager Mark Cooper's side backed by green energy tycoon Dale Vince, will now look forward to rubbing shoulders with former FA Cup winners Coventry City, Blackpool, Port Vale, Swindon Town and bitter Gloucestershire rivals Cheltenham Town in League Two.

Vince, who rescued the 128-yearold club from the brink of adminstration in 2010, cut a delighted figure in the Royal Box as cap-tain Liam Noble lifted the National League gong in front of three thousand ecstatic fans from Gloucestershire.

For Cooper, it was a sweet vic-tory after his previous Wembley dreams of leading Swindon Town to the Championship in 2015 were


