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- 1. At least half a million UK children start each school day too hungry or malnourished to learn.
- 2. A hungry child cannot concentrate and will miss out on the most important lessons, taught in the morning, if not given anything to eat.
- 3. The Magic Breakfast model of school breakfast provision has been shown to improve educational outcomes for disadvantaged children. Independent research, funded by the Education Endowment Foundation and carried out by the Institute for Fiscal Studies, found that primary schools that offered a free, nutritious Magic Breakfast boosted their pupils' reading, writing and maths results by an average of 2 months' progress over the course of a year.





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Solving the problem for good

There were 4.1 million children living in poverty in the UK in 2016-17. That's 30% of children, or 9 in a classroom of 30.

Even with an injection of £26m from the DfE, there will still be hungry children missing out on their morning lessons, missing out on life chances, because they are too hungry to learn. We will continue to work with industry and fundraise for current partner schools and those on our waiting list which do not meet NSBP criteria.

Longer term, we are campaigning for school breakfasts for the most vulnerable children to become government policy.

What is the scope of the National School Breakfast Programme?



Over the next two years the Government will be investing up to £26 million in healthy breakfast provision in over 1,770 schools in disadvantaged areas of England, with a focus on the Department for Education's Opportunity Areas.

The Programme will be funded through the Government's soft drinks industry levy.

Schools are eligible for support if they currently have either no breakfast provision or breakfast provision where there is scope for improvement and 50% or more pupils are in IDACI bands A-F. [IDACI = Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index].
