

- **3.** A lower cost per meal












How do parents assess the quality of school meals?



























Willingness and/or ability to pay for a school breakfast provision

Of those that would like to see a breakfast option, but don't currently have one available in their schools, just over half would be willing to pay for it. This presents an additional revenue opportunity for caterers and schools, as well as the learning benefits a healthy breakfast gives to pupils.

Summary:



2023 school meal uptake

- 58% take meals every day
- Valued by parents for providing a hot meal and convenience



Meal pre-ordering

- 64% secondary parents want their children to be able to
- Only 5% currently have the option to do so



How to increase meal uptake

- Wider selection of meals
- High quality/more appetising
- Decreased cost per meal



Free school meals

- 88% of eligible parents use them
- 62% say FSM improve their quality of life

Share information on standards and nutritional value

Increase confidence and engagement with school meals









Who responded?

the school food people



87 respondents across the LACA membership ranging from single-site providers, LA's and large commercial providers from England & Wales completed the survey.

These respondents provide services across more than 8,350 schools feeding over 1 million pupils every day.





What did you say?


the school food people

Just under 96% of survey respondents are still experiencing food shortages and substitutions from their supply chain.



We asked how this compared to **March 2023** with 51% of respondents saying the situation had not changed or had worsened.








What's affected?

We asked which food categories have been most affected since March 2023:






Eggs, pasta and potatoes were mentioned most frequently.



By how much?

We asked our respondents, **compared to March 2023**, have you received notification from your suppliers of any further increases in the cost of food and ingredients?

For the 95.2% of caterers that advised of further price rises, we asked them to identify a % increase across key food categories:



The majority of respondents are experiencing further price rises of up to 20% across all categories, but, its important to note these are additional rises on top of those already reported in since September, November 2022 and March 2023, where some caterers reported increases at that time of more than 50%.




Meal prices

We asked our respondents to provide the selling price of the 'paid for meal / meal of the day since March 2020 in their primary schools and secondary schools.

Date	Primary	Secondary
March 2020	£2.23	£2.32
May 2022	£2.27	£2.35
Sep 2022	£2.32	£2.40
January 2023	£2.34	£2.39
April 2023	£2.38	£2.45
June 2023	£2.38	£2.46






On average, the price of a meal has increased by 6.6% since March 2020 with further increases expected.



Further price rises...

We asked respondents if they were aware of any further planned increases in the selling price of the paid for meal.




We asked those respondents who were aware of further increases, how much they expected this to be with an average meal price from September 2023 of £2.70.

A meal price of £2.70 from September 2023 will represent a 19% increase since March 2020.




Recruitment

Are you experiencing recruitment challenges?




When asked how the situation compared to March 2023, **79%** of respondents said that, compared it had not changed or actually got worse.






Recruitment

Which roles have been challenging to fill?




In addition to recruitment challenges, respondents also reported they are seeing sickness absence levels of 17% on average, although some advised that they are experiencing levels in excess of 30%.



School Food Standards

We asked, how has the rising cost of food affected your ability to meet the mandatory School Food Standards?

In June 2023, 20% of respondents told us that meeting the standards in full is becoming increasingly difficult - this is an increase on 12.5% in November and 19% in March
